How can Otago South River Care help?

- have a minimum of 3-5m riparian buffer,
- purchase required plants from the list of approved species,
- look after the plants after the initial establishment phase.

Recommended Plants Zone Plant Latin name Spacing (m) Lower Zone Sedge Carex secta 1.5 Carex virgata 1.5 Sedge Toetoe (toi toi) Austroderia richardaii Mid Zone Flax Phormium tenax 2 Mingimingi Coprosma propinqua 2 Ribbonwood Plagianthus regius 2 Narrow-leaf Hoheria angustifolia 2 lacebark **Upper Zone** Cordyline australis Cabbage Tree 2 Kānuka Kunzea ericoides Mānuka 2 Leptospermum scoparium

How many plants will I need?

The sedges (carex species) in the lower zone will need to be planted about 1-1.5 metres apart.

For the rest of the species, plan on one every 1.5 –2 metres.

This means that for every 100 metres you will need approximately 200 plants per bank for a full three zone planting.

Where can I get plants from?

You can get plants from local nurseries, or ask us and we may be able to help source some for you. Please make sure your plants are eco sourced for the South Otago area and get the largest grade you can to help ensure the success of your riparian planting.
